Roy Jefferson visited our club on March 21. Roy has been a member of the Anaheim Hills Rotary club since 1992 and served as club president in 2019-20. The club was selected as the Best Small club during that year, receiving the Presidential Citation and Rotary Citation for Membership Development.

Roy has served as Assistant Governor several times, District Club Service Chair, District Membership Chair, District Conference Chair, Foundation Dinner Chair and even had the honor of representing our district on the Rotary Rose Parade Float in 2011.

Under Roys leadership the district has added 25 members this year. Roy is also working on developing new clubs in Seal Beach and Westminster. Foundation giving is up to \$1.25M, almost double of the \$680k that was donated last year.

Roy is encouraging everyone to attend the March for Mental Health on April 27th at Yorba Regional Park. 50,000 people commit suicide every year and over 100,000 people try to commit suicide. Each step represents a commitment to understanding, empathy, and support for those affected by mental health challenges.

The District Conference will be held on May 10 - 12 in Long Beach. Roy asked that we host a booth at the Hospitality Night on May 10.

Charlotte Dobyns, accompanied by several students, visited the club to showcase the remarkable initiatives underway at the La Sierra Adult Transition Program.

A student-run coffee bar has been established to offer coffee to both students and administrators at La Vista. Transition students are actively involved in the process, learning how to brew coffee and creating seasonal drinks akin to those found in professional coffee houses. The coffee bar will soon open to the public for limited hours, beginning May 8.

The Adult Transition Program secured a \$20,000 CTA grant to facilitate the installation of student gardens. These funds were utilized to set up two raised garden beds for cultivating vegetables and flowers. Currently, students are tending to a variety of plants, including flowers, beets, cilantro, and onions.
